About the school

This is an exciting time in the history of Richmond School and Sixth Form College; a history that goes back nearly 700 years. With the refurbishment and new buildings, teachers and students now have facilities that rank as some of the best in the country. On December 1st 2017 Richmond School and Sixth Form College became part of the Areté Learning Trust, a relatively new Trust, established when Stokesley School converted to academy status in April 2015. In an educational climate in which there is so much volatility and change, we wanted to ensure we could secure our future, stay true to our values and work with others who are similarly committed to helping all young people, whatever their starting point, to "be the best they can be."

We are delighted that a recent Ofsted inspection (January 2017) confirmed that we continue to be a good school, with leadership and management, and behaviour and safety, all deemed as 'Good'.

This is particularly pleasing because the inspection took place under the new, tougher, criteria. Our goal now is to push on towards becoming a truly outstanding school. We are confident that we will achieve this through our shared responsibility for the future success of all students.

The Wider School Community

Richmond School is situated on the edge of the beautiful Yorkshire Dales, approximately four miles from the A1 (M) at the northern end of the extensive county of North Yorkshire. It is an extremely attractive market town in part of what has become known as 'Herriot Country'. Richmond itself has all the services of a market town and is within easy reach of Darlington and Teesside, with Newcastle, York and Leeds each less than an hour's drive away. The nearby town of Darlington is on the main East-Coast line

between Edinburgh and London, whilst the Dales area itself has a rich, rural and industrial heritage. Musicians, thespians, walkers, potholers, campers, historians and many other interest groups find Richmond to be an ideal base.



Over thirty five primary schools contribute to the School's Year 7 intake. The School has an admission limit of 250. Students travel from the borders with County Durham, from the Catterick area and from Wensleydale and also from the head of Swaledale, as well as from the town itself - testimony to the fact that the School enjoys an excellent reputation over a wide area which extends well beyond the Dales.

School Performance

Richmond School and Sixth Form College has always had a good reputation and it features well in school performance tables. In January 2017 OFSTED



reported that Richmond School is a good school. We have, at present, 1,361 students, 250 of whom are in the Sixth Form.



Our students' attainment overall is generally well above the National Average. In 2017 our Attainment 8 score was 49.4 (44.2 for England) and the percentage achieving English and Maths at 5+ was 51%, 12% above national.

At KS5, attainment measures tend to be slightly below the national equivalents because the prior attainment of our cohorts tend to be below the national average. However, our overall value-added has been positive for the last three years and was close to being significantly positive (+0.14) in 2016. At A Level our students made above expected national progress and we were graded a 3 (Excellent) on ALPS.

Professional Development & Learning

Richmond School and Sixth
Form College prides itself on
being a school where teachers
can grow professionally. Our

hours of professional learning
and development and
encourage all staff to be the
best they can be.

In School the professional learning hubs support the development of teaching and learning through a range of opportunities such as lesson study, professional coaching, specialist SEN support and developing teaching and learning for those new to the profession. Teachers are free to choose the direction of their whole school CPD provision, selecting to attend sessions that best fit their Professional Development needs.

Academic Organisation

From September 2018 in Key Stage 3 (Years 7 and 8), all students follow a broad common curriculum with a strong emphasis on English, Mathematics and Science together with an extended core of Modern Language (French or German), History, Geography, Religious Studies, Art, Music, Dance, Drama, Technology, ICT and Physical Education.



At the end of Year 8 the students select their Key Stage 4 Programme of Study which, for the majority, follows a common-core curriculum which includes PE and GCSE courses in English (Language and Literature), Maths, Science, a Language, and a Humanities subject. The students can select two further GCSE subject from a wide range of courses, including technology, health & social care, business studies, computer science, religious studies, media, photography, art, drama, dance and engineering.

All students undertake a "Learning for Life" programme for 40 minutes per week.
Teachers are organised into specialist teams and deliver aspects of PSHCE on a rotational basis.

Richmond Sixth Form College is successful, the students take 3 A Level subjects and the vast majority continue their education at University. There is a strong emphasis on extracurricular activity in the Sixth Form and Sixth Formers contribute in many ways to the wider life of the School and College.

Pastoral Organisation

The School is run on a year-based system with form tutors, a dedicated pastoral manager per year group and a lead-learning manager to oversee the Key Stage.

An Assistant Head Teacher oversees the Sixth Form College with the support of a lead-learning manager, two pastoral managers and an academic mentor.



Each student is part of a form group in which friendships can be made and responsibilities exercised. A student's form tutor and the lead-learning manager take a keen interest in his or her progress and development throughout their time at Richmond School. Newly appointed teaching staff are usually asked to carry out a form tutor role in the School. The form tutor "champions" the cause of each member of his or her form group.

The School places great emphasis on good staff-student relationships and on providing a hard-working, well-disciplined atmosphere in which students can flourish as individuals.

Extra-Curricular Activities

All staff are actively encouraged to involve themselves in this important part of school life. Sports such as athletics, badminton, cricket, football, netball, and rugby thrive at Richmond School. There is a full programme of competitive inter-school games.

Music has a strong tradition in the School. Instrumental instruction is available and there is an opportunity to join the School Orchestra, Wind Band or one of the other musical ensembles.

Drama is also a thriving subject, with a number of productions performed each year. Many other clubs and societies run in School throughout the school year.

The School runs a wide range of school visits. Examples include: a science trip to Cern, geography field work on the East coast and Year 7 visits to France, as well as the German exchange in Y9 and 10 to name a few.
