Continuous Cricket Success

The Year 7 Cricket team is having a great year and squad members have proven themselves to be a very talented group of students. They are still competing in three major cup competitions. They have surpassed themselves, reaching the Area Final in the Yorkshire U12 David English Bunbury Competition, which is to be played at Richmond Cricket Club on Monday 4 July. Their opposition is still to be confirmed. In reaching this final they have beaten Stokesley by 20 runs, Acklam Grange by 30 runs and Allertonshire by 20 runs, with notable performances by both Owen Kelly and Joe Shields. Owen Kelly scored 89 not out in the last game.

Further to this, they have reached the Quarter-Finals of the U12 Dennis Richards Trophy, and are set to play against St Aidans on Wednesday 29 June.

In the Area Cup the students defeated Bedale Year 8 in the Quarter Finals (Finnis Barlow 38 not out, Lewis Cocks 30, and Ben Edwards 26 not out) and await the opposition for the semi-finals.

They have a busy end of term trying to complete all of these fixtures and we appreciate the School and staff allowing them the time to play.

The Year 8 and 9 Cricket Team has also shown encouraging signs of improvement but was unfortunately knocked out of the County Cup in round 2, beaten by strong cricketing schools in close matches. The Year 9 team was knocked out by Harrogate Grammar School in a brilliant game, eventually losing by 1 run. Needing 14 runs off the last over Richmond nearly sneaked home but could only manage 12, the main run contributors being Tom Pickering (51 not out) and Josh Dowson (45 not out). All year groups still remain in the Area Cup competition where there is a possibility of the Year 9 team meeting the Year 10s in the final!

The Year 10 Cricket Team has continued with its success from last year by winning every match so far this season and has currently reached the semi finals of the Area Cup and beaten St John Fisher in the regional final of the North Yorkshire/East Yorkshire and Cleveland County Cup, where the team will now play Woodhouse Grove School for a place in the ECB Yorkshire Cup 20/20 final. Again, much of the success has been down to excellent **team** performances where the players have amassed large innings scores through the powerful middle order batsmen of Tom Pickering, Dan Osborn and Joss Mercer alongside the consistent opening batsman Adam Cocks.

ROUNDERS ALL ROUND

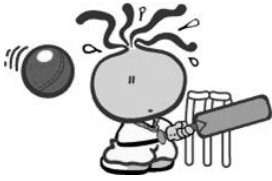
