GREAT minds were asked to think alike in a problem solving exercise designed to tax children in North Yorkshire.



Year 7 students at Richmond School took part in a day of puzzle solving to stimulate their interest in maths and encourage team work.

Children were taken out of their conventional classrooms to tackle a variety of exercises ranging from jigsaws to 3D paper folding. Staff from feeder primary schools were also invited to join the session.
