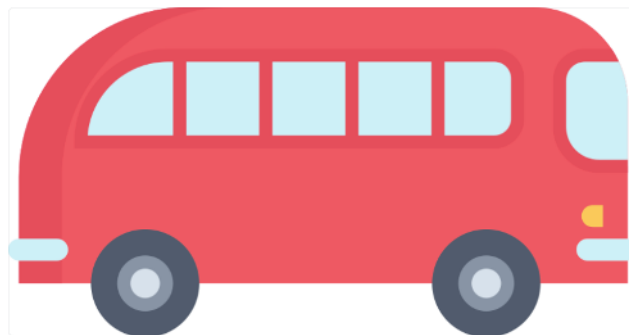

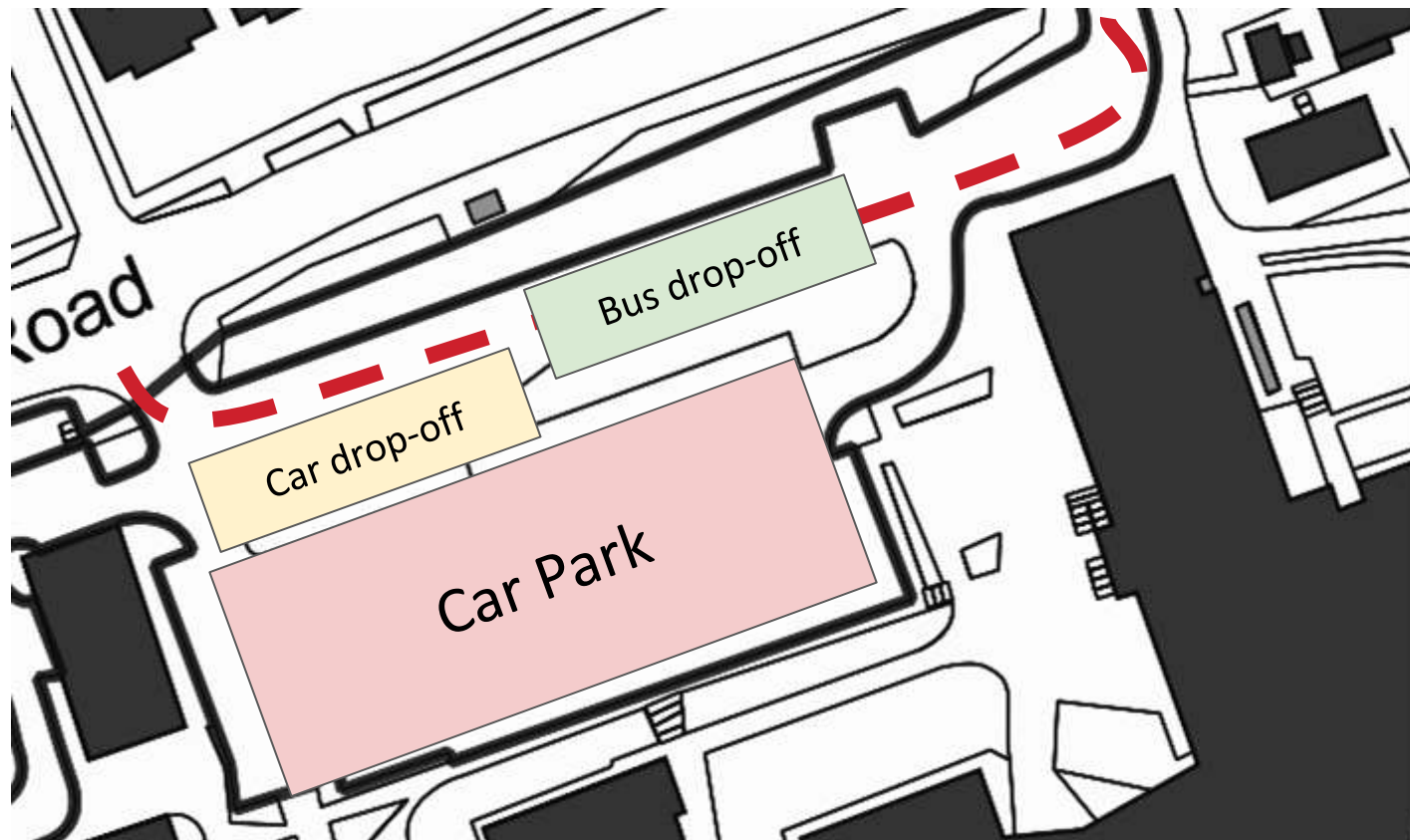
A minibus crash has seen a man taken to hospital with serious injuries and children hurt.

Before school





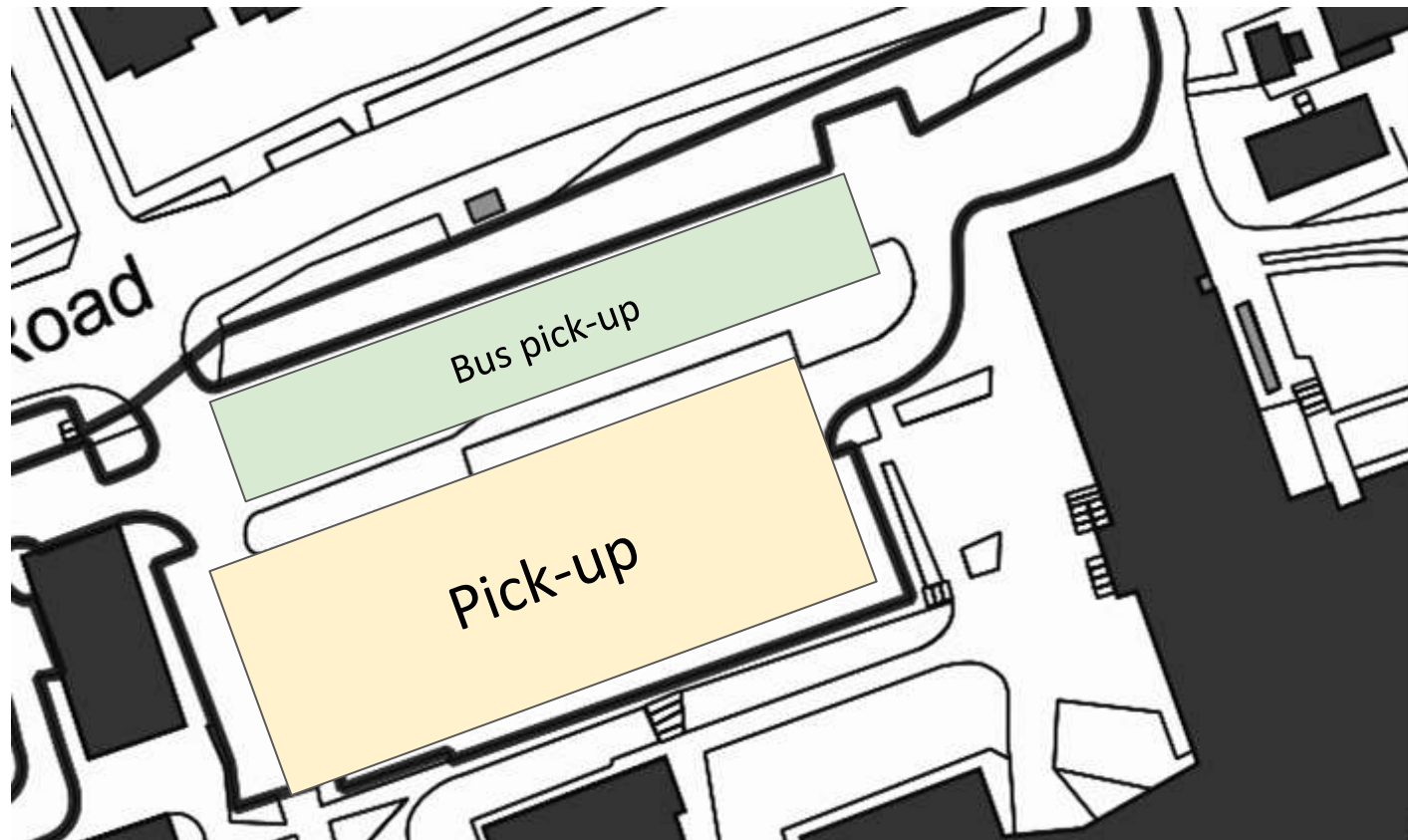
Before school

- School starts at 08:50
- Buses drop-off in the bus park
- Cars drop-off in the yellow zone at the end of the bus park
- Use the crossings - do not cut through the car park
- Do not loiter - **go to your muster point**





After school





After school

- School ends at 15:30
- **Safely** leave school site - immediately
- Follow the school crossings - **do not cut through the car park**
- **Full uniform until you get home**





On the buses

- Go straight to the bus - either from home or after school
- Remain seated
- Continue to follow the school's expectations
- Do not do anything that will distract the driver
- Behaviour that would be deemed unsafe on a school bus **could result in a permanent ban from the bus**





By Car

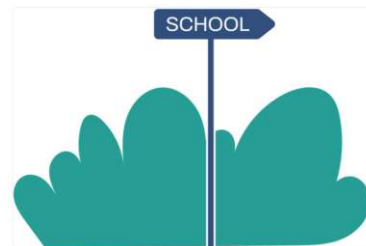
- Drop-off in the yellow zone
- The car park closes at 15:20
- Be aware of others - both picking up and dropping off
- Consider neighbours/residents





Walking

- Follow all road rules - use pedestrian crossings where possible
- Remain in uniform
- Represent the school
- **Focus on where you are going**





Beyond the school gate

5.9 Power to discipline beyond the school gate

All students represent the school when they are wearing the school uniform. For this reason, we expect all students to be mindful of this and treat members of the public with the utmost respect including on local buses, school buses, in shops and on the way to and from school. Students can expect to receive a sanction if they are found at any time:

- To be bringing the name or reputation of the school into disrepute
- To be involved in something which could have repercussions for the orderly running of the school
- To pose a threat to another student, staff member or member of the public

Richmond School takes the behaviour of the students in the community very seriously and asks all members to maintain the highest levels of conduct, displaying our value of Respect at all times.



Beyond the school gate

- Dangerous behaviour can result in a significant consequence in school
- Students represent the school on their way to and from school, but this also counts during the holidays, in the evenings or at weekends
- Examples include dangerous/silly behaviour on roads, use of social media outside of school or anti-social behaviour in towns/villages



Stay Safe

- Precautions made in school to keep you safe
- Responsible for your own behaviour
- Representing the school
- Your peers have the right to travel to and from school safely
- **School can use significant sanctions for behaviour outside of school**
